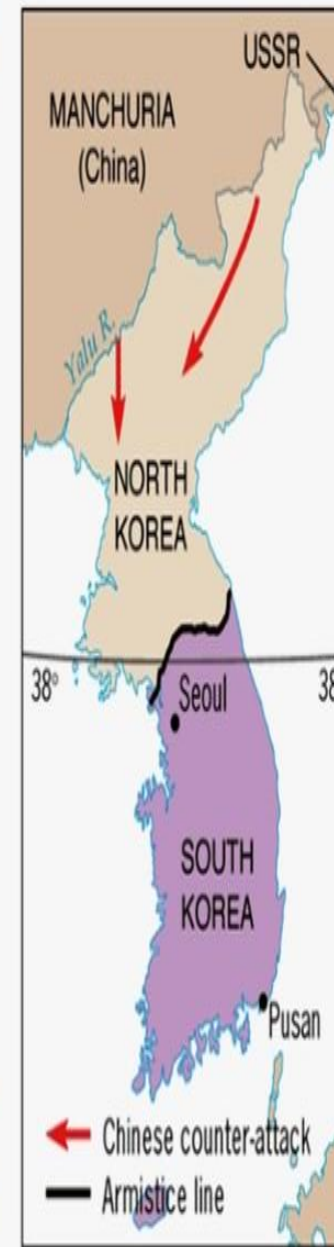

DALLAS, Nov. 22—A 30-year-old woman, a figure in a pro-Castro group who was shot in the breast when she stepped into a car on the city street, was charged last night with assassinating President Kennedy.

She was arrested at 3:45 p.m. after a search party had been set up for the assassination of the President, as the suspected killer of a policeman on the street at the 11th Street station, who was shot when the President's car was passing.

Chief of Police James Curry announced at 10:45 P.M. that the woman had been arrested and was being held in the city jail.

The woman, who was identified as a figure in the pro-Castro group, was charged with the assassination of the President.

President Is Struck Down by a Rifle Shot From Building on Motorcade Route—Johnson, Riding Behind, Is Unhurt

DALLAS, Nov. 22—President John Fitzgerald Kennedy was shot and killed by an assassin today.

He died of a wound in the brain caused by a rifle bullet that was fired at him as he was riding through downtown Dallas in a motorcade.

Vice President Lyndon Baines Johnson, who was riding in the third car behind Mr. Kennedy's, was sworn in as the 36th President of the United States 90 minutes after Mr. Kennedy's death.

Mr. Johnson is 55 years old; Mr. Kennedy was 45.

Shortly after the assassination, Lee H. Oswald, described as a one-time defector to the Soviet Union, active in the Fair Play for Cuba Committee, was arrested by the Dallas police. Tonight he was accused of the killing.

Suspect Captured After Scuffle

Oswald, 24 years old, was also accused of slaying a policeman who had approached him in the street. Oswald was subdued after a scuffle with a second policeman in a nearby theater.

The shooting took place at 11:50 P.M., Central standard time (11:00 P.M. New York time).

There was no laughing matter for Bill Clinton as he stood before the Senate on Tuesday, responding to the charges that he had committed adultery and misled the nation about his relationship with a young woman.

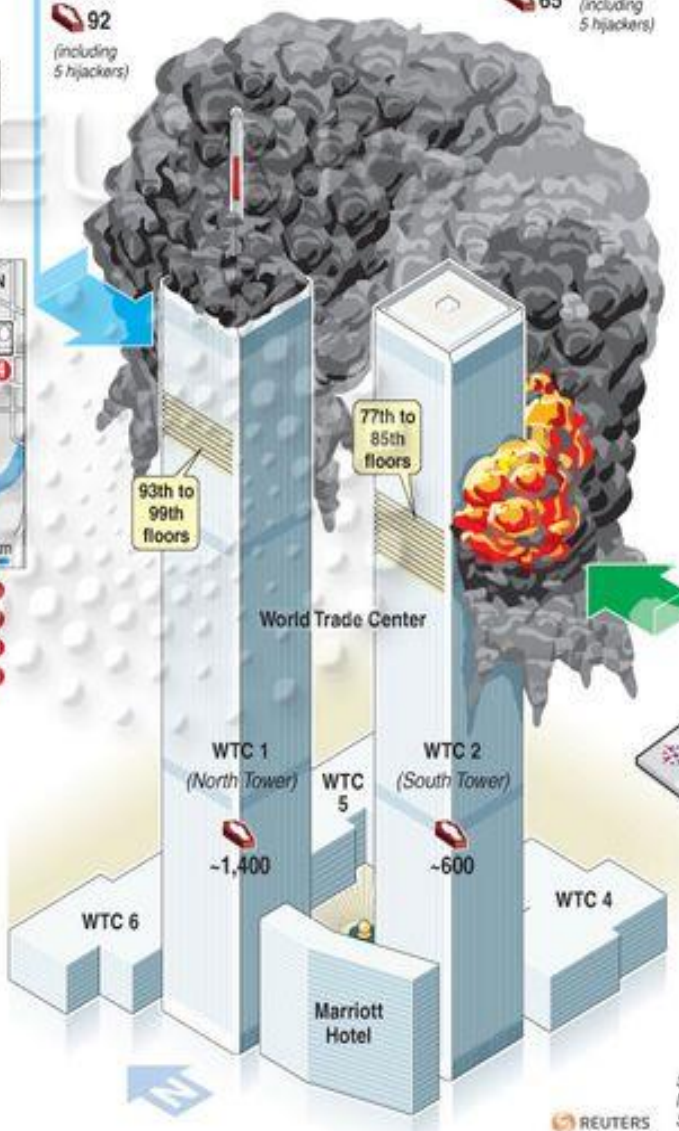

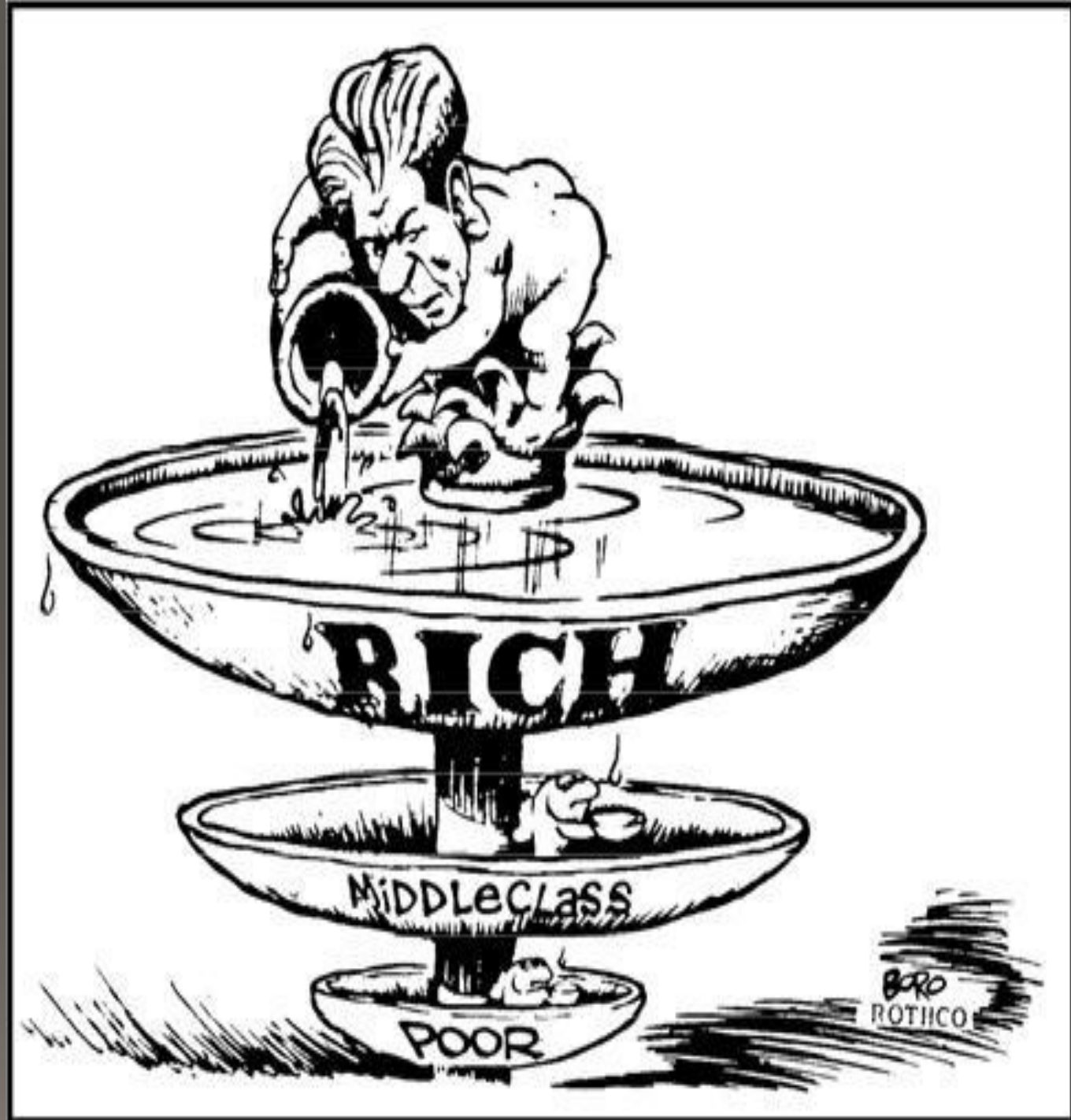
